Let's Pick and Choose, Reading är en lästräningsserie i engelska för åk 4–6.

PROVLEKTION: Läsa

Följande provlektion, *Christmas*, är ett utdrag ur *Let's Pick and Choose, Reading 3* där eleverna tränar sin läsförståelse i engelska. Lektionen består av tre sidor med text och frågor.

Så här arbetar du med provlektionen:

1. Skriv ut sidorna och kopiera upp så att eleverna har varsitt exemplar av de tre sidorna.
2. Läs texten tillsammans, antingen att du som lärare läser den högt för eleverna eller att eleverna läser själva. Om eleverna ska läsa högt bör de ges tid att förbereda sig.
3. Gå igenom texten. Vad handlar den om? Finns det några svåra ord? Vad kan de tänkas betyda? Är det viktigt att förstå alla ord i texten eller förstår man ändå vad texten handlar om?
4. Låt eleverna lösa uppgifterna, i sin egen takt.
5. Gå igenom svaren tillsammans och låt eleverna rätta.
